Flower Wrist Pincushion

Pins and needles will always be close at hand when you use this handy pincushion designed to wear on your wrist. A plastic base inserted in the pincushion before stuffing prevents pokes and stabs.

The pattern includes complete instructions for making the pincushion, including directions for tailoring the length of the wrist band to fit your wrist.

Flower Wrist Pincushions make great gifts for friends who sew or quilt, too.



Supplies Needed:

Used For	Supplies Needed	Amount Needed
Flower pincushion	Fabric of your choice	Two, 6" x 6"
Wrist strap	Coordinating fabric of your choice	One, 4" x 12"
Wrist strap cushioning	Batting such as Quilter's 80/20 or Poly-fill Traditional Quilt Batting from Fairfield	One, 1 $\frac{3}{4}$ " x 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
Stuffing for pincushion	Fiberfill such as Soft Touch Poly-fil Supreme Polyester Fiberfill from Fairfield	Approximately 2 to 4 oz.
Assembly of pincushion	Fusible interfacing Heavy template plastic $\frac{3}{4}$ " Velcro™ Perle cotton or heavy crochet thread Button	6" x 6" for pincushion back 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ " circle for pincushion base 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " for strap closure 50" to make divisions in flower $\frac{1}{2}$ " to $\frac{3}{4}$ " for center of flower

Flower Wrist Pincushion

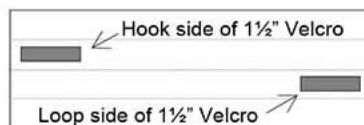
A. Prepare the pincushion.

- ❑ Fuse the 6" x 6" piece of interfacing to the wrong side of the 6" x 6" pincushion back. Trace a 5" circle (template on next page) in the middle of the piece on the interfacing side.
- ❑ With right sides together, align the two 6" x 6" pincushion pieces.
- ❑ Stitch around the marked lines, leaving about a 2" opening for turning.
- ❑ Cut out, leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Snip curves and turn right side out.
- ❑ Stuff the pincushion to the desired amount using **Fairfield's fiberfill of your choice**.
- ❑ Punch a small hole in the center of the 2¾" plastic base and insert into the bottom of the pincushion.
- ❑ Topstitch the seam closed. Set pincushion aside.

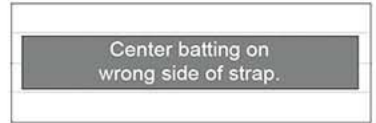
B. Prepare the strap.

- ❑ Measure wrist and add 3". Adjust the length of the 4" x 12" strap if needed. (See note at right.)
- ❑ Cut the batting ½" shorter than the strap.
- ❑ With wrong sides together, fold the fabric strip in half lengthwise (2" x 12"); press. Bring the raw edges to the middle and press again. Fold the piece in half (1" x 12"); press.
- ❑ With wrong sides together, turn under ¼" on each short end of the strap.
- ❑ With right sides up, attach Velcro™ to each end of the strap.

Example: Your wrist measurement is 8". Add 3" to get 11". Cut the strap to 4" x 11". Cut the batting to 1" x 10½".



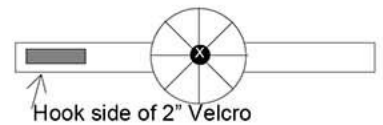
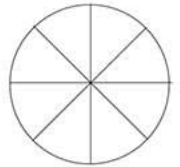
- ❑ Open the strap piece and center the 1¾" piece of **Fairfield batting** on the strip between the outer folds.



- ❑ Fold the fabric over the batting, bringing each long raw edge to the center seam.
- ❑ Fold the strap in half matching long edges. Topstitch all around the strap, about ⅛" from edge.

C. Assemble the Flower Wrist Pincushion.

- ❑ Thread a large-eyed needle with a 50" piece of perle cotton or crochet thread. Tie a knot in the end.
- ❑ Bring needle up through pincushion from middle of bottom (through the hole in the plastic stabilizer) to middle of top.
- ❑ Wrap the thread around the pincushion and come back up through the middle several times to make "petals" for your flower.
- ❑ Bring the thread up from the middle of the bottom, through the holes of a button, and back down to finish the middle of the pincushion.
- ❑ Sew the pincushion securely to the strap, centering it on the strap with the hook side of the Velcro up.

Flower Wrist Pincushion Templates

Flower Wrist Pincushion Front and Back (5" Circle)

Cut two from fabric of your choice to make pincushion front and back.

If desired, fussy cut the circle for the front of the pincushion from a large floral fabric.

Flower Wrist Pincushion Base (2¾" Circle)

Cut one from heavy-duty template plastic or other plastic.

Appliqué to Go

Thread Case holds 72 colors of thread or other supplies in clear pockets. Magnetic clasps close the case and handles make it easy to carry or hang the case.

Wear the Scissor Holder around your neck — your scissors are close at hand but you're protected from their sharp points.

Project Roll holds blocks in progress. Place blocks on flannel lining; roll to keep blocks flat, clean, and ready to go. Attached ribbon ties hold things together. Pattern and other supplies may be stored inside tube.
