

# **Starry Night Sampler**



If you are just joining us, be sure to <u>click here for the material list and first block</u>. Don't worry about being behind, you can jump in at anytime.

Today's block is a cool snowflake block that measures 9" when finished. While it has simple straight lines, seam placement will be key. Let's take a look and get started.

9" finished block #StarryNightQuilt

### **Cutting Instructions:**


- Cut 1 Charcoal Net 3 3/4" square
- Cut 1 Ocean Polka Dot 5 3/4" square \*sub cut into 4 triangles
- Cut 2 Charcoal Dress Stripe 5 1/2" x 3 3/4" \*cut on bias
- Cut 2 Turquoise Dress Stripe 5 1/2" x 3 3/4" \*cut on bias

#### Additional Notes:

- -Stripe blocks have been cut on bias for print direction only. Feel free to adjust back to straight grain based on your fabric.
- -Sub cut large polka dot square into 4 triangles.

## Snowflake


### **Cutting Instructions**




9" finished block #StarryNightQuilt

### **Sewing Assembly:**

 Following color key, place a triangle *right sides* together to the rectangle and stitch using 1/4" seam allowance. Press open and repeat to the other side.




- 2. Repeat step 1 to create 2 finished units.
- 3. With remaining pieces, stitch center square **right sides together** with 1/4" seam allowance to the rectangle. Press and repeat to opposite side.



Using 1/4" seam allowance, join each unit together to create the finished block. Press seams and trim block to a 9 1/2" square. This will leave you 1/4' seam allowance all around for joining to other blocks at the end.

Remember, you will need 1 finished Snowflake block to complete the Starry Night Quilt Sampler.

For those of you that are seasoned quilters this block will be a breeze but if this is your first block of the month series have no fear, I'm here to help you through it. To help you achieve success with each block, I've put together a few of my **favorite sewing tips here**.
