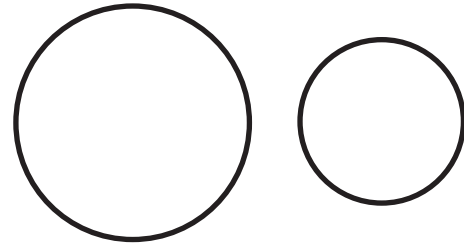


Owl Plushie

Eyes

Cut 2 from felt or scraps

Materials:

1 Fabric Fat Quarter

Coordinating Fabric Scraps

Felt Pieces

Needle + Thread

Sewing Machine

Two Buttons

Poly-fil® Fiber Fill

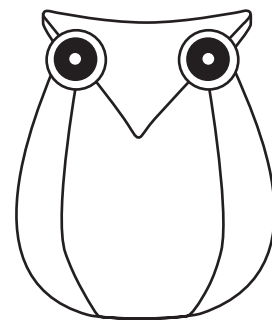
- 1 Cut out coordinating fabric and felt.
- 2 Match up pieces using guides ■ and ▲ and then sew pieces together along edges to create a cone.
- 3 Stuff tightly with Poly-fil®, leaving the very tip empty.
- 4 Fold tip of cone down to create the beak and attach to belly with needle and thread.
- 5 Baste around bottom edge and pull loose ends to cinch and tie.
- 6 Using a blanket stitch, sew felt circle to bottom of owl.
- 7 Sew the felt eyes in place and attach buttons.

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Tip: Increase or decrease this pattern to make larger or smaller owls!
